Who We Serve

2003: AYTEF Founded

AYTEF was originally based at the Washington Park Tennis Center on Atlanta's westside, partnering with organizations like USTA Atlanta, Universal Tennis Academy (UTA), Boys & Girls Club, the Atlanta Police Department's Police Athletic League (PAL), and Laureus Sport for Good Foundation.



2020: New Site and Location

In response to the COVID-19 pandemic, AYTEF relocated to the Fair Oaks Tennis Center in Marietta, GA, in December 2020. This move enabled year-round tennis programs, virtual and in-person academic enrichment, monthly community events, and summer camps.



2021-2023: Growth Years

AYTEF deepened its commitment to under-resourced youth by focusing its efforts on its primary site, the Fair Oaks Tennis Center. Moving away from previous citywide partnerships, AYTEF now prioritizes creating a profound and lasting impact within the Fair Oaks community. This dedication was formalized through a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) with the Cobb Parks and Recreation Department. In recognition of its impactful work, AYTEF was honored as the 2022 USTA Georgia NJTL of the Year and the GPTA Community Outreach Service Award in 2023.



AYTEF launched its new 3-year strategic plan to strengthen the organization's foundation and broaden its impact in the Fair Oaks and Cobb community. The plan focuses on enhancing the quality and integrity of AYTEF programs while prioritizing measurable success metrics to drive meaningful outcomes. It also emphasizes expanding program accessibility to better serve the needs of local families, creating strategic partnerships to ensure sustainable staffing and operations, and increasing staff capacity with a focus on retention. Additionally, it aims to diversify the organization's funding portfolio and raise awareness of its vital work throughout the Atlanta area.



In Fair Oaks, one of our key service areas, the challenges facing the community are particularly significant. Families have identified access to afterschool programs and recreational opportunities as the third highest need, emphasizing the critical role these programs play in holistic youth development, academic success, and providing a safe, structured environment beyond school hours. Additionally, there is an urgent need for reading and math support, highlighting the importance of educational enrichment programs that help bridge learning gaps and equip students with the skills necessary for long-term success.

Our Approach

Player Pathway

AYTEF offers structured, year-round tennis programming through the GameSetMatch Player Development Pathway, guiding K-8th graders from beginner to competitive levels. Focused on serving minority and under-resourced communities, we ensure affordable and accessible tennis opportunities through discounted rates. Our pathway includes:

- Summer camps and competitive exposure in USTA events

Learning Hub

The Learning Hub compliments the GameSetMatch Player Pathway providing hands-on learning for K-8 youth enrolled in the year-round SET program. Students develop confidence, resilience, and critical thinking skills. This integrated approach ensures that participants thrive in school, sports, and everyday life. Our Learning Hub includes:

Atlanta Open

Junior Team Tennis

AYTEF's 10U Junior Team Tennis (JTT) team made history by finishing 1st in USTA Atlanta's Cobb League, earning a spot in the JTT Qualifier in Buford, where they secured 2nd place and advanced to the state qualifier in Macon. We are incredibly proud of our student athletes for their outstanding teamwork and achievement. Community Partnerships

In June, AYTEF participated in the **Laureus Day of Sport**, providing tennis instruction to City of Atlanta youth alongside other Atlanta-based sports organizations. In November, collaborated with **Don't Lose Hope ATL** on a youth-led community service project honoring gathering supplies for the unhoused communities. Additionally, AYTEF joined the **Cobb Collaborative** as a local nonprofit and was honored to be selected for **Cobb Community Foundation's Magic Gift Guide.**

AYTEF Traditions

AYTEF continued its cherished youth traditions, including Friday Night Block Parties, the **October Pumpkin Carving Contest**, a November service project, two weeks of AYTEF youth-only summer camp, and the annual **Awards Night** celebrating AYTEF staff, youth, and volunteers. We also introduced a **Parent-Child Tennis Day**, where our players had the unique opportunity to teach their parents how to play tennis, creating a fun and engaging role-reversal experience.


